This experience has underscored the importance of team work and shared purpose in both professional and personal endeavors.







Elena di Savoia (b. Cetinje, Montenegro, 1883 – d. 1952, Montpellier, France) was an Italian queen and a Montenegrin princess, daughter of King Nikola I Petrović-Njegoš.

She grew up in Montenegro and at 12 years old she studied in Saint Petersburg,

Russia, until she was 18. She was interested in pastel painting, hunting and fishing. She also attended the Russian royal house. In 1886 she moved to Bari with her new husband, Vittorio Emanuele, who became King of Italy. In recognition of her great faith and the charitable activities she supported, Pope Pius XI bestowed her the highest honour at that time for a woman, the Golden Rose of Christianity, twice in 1930 and 1937.

conditions of war, I do not know what will happen tomorrow. But WEMov for me will forever be a symbol of the light at the end of a tunnel that inspires hope.








It has been wonderful to meet all these talented people from all over Europe and






With the invitation to be part of the COST action, first of all, I got the opportunity to collaborate with top specialists on the project's issues. Also, in the course of the work, I did extensive research, which not only gave me material for the current project, but opened new views and ideas for further projects. At the same time, my engagement in this project was presented and positively evaluated in the scientific community, to which I belong and work at the Institute of National History as a



specialized Macedonian scientific institution for researching history.

I deepened the knowledge of pioneer women and of mapping. Now I know of memorialising not only architects, but also other professions, so not only through built works, but also through street names etc. I also collaborated with other WGs and had the possibility to contribute about what I knew in collaboration with historians particularly on archives, and reflected about the large recent Romanian migration and the historic German migration in milestones, among others. I learned about collaboratively writing articles



with the method of Benedicte (writing and then discussion with chronometre).

PERSONALLY



WEMov is a perfect opportunity for a historian to engage in interdisciplinary research that spans different chronological periods. The project brought together scholars from several dozen of countries with different backgrounds, which helps everyone see best research practices. The creation of a stable communication system made it possible to maintain a constant dialogue with team members. WEMov website provides access to project materials, both for participants and all interested persons. The use of various forms of research activities created conditions for expanding the possibilities of source heuristics and analytics. Fieldwork (visits to museums, migrant communities etc.) contributed to a broader

understanding of the presence and economic contribution of migrant women in European history.

About twenty Georgian women are known in the history of Ottoman Empire, who were the wives of the sultans and members of the Ottoman Dynasty. Only a few of them wrow able to receive the highest title for a woman – "Valide (Min-Sultan".

In the 16th century, the Ottomans captured Western Georgia and sold Georgian captives, women becoming concubines in the harem of the sultan. One of the women who received the highest title of "Valide (Mother) Sultan" is Mihrishah Valide Sultan. She entered the Harem in 1757 and soon became the chosen woman of Sultan Mustafa III. In 1761 she gave birth to her second child, a son, Şehzade Selim – Sultan Selim III, first son born in the Ottoman Dynasty 30 years later. Only after Selim ascended the throne did Mihrishah become the Valide Sultan. She never interfered in the politics of her son and devoted her full life to charity. She died On October 16, 1805 at the age of 61.



Another famous Valide Sultan was Nakşidil Valide Sultan. Mother of Sultan Mahmud II. 






PhD, and I am so grateful for this lifechanging experience.
